UUK stands firm on flexibility on declaration

Universities UK will today press for any reforms on the Bologna Declaration, on the comparability of European Qualifications to be flexible. It wants any European qualifications framework to recognise that, in the United Kingdom, masters degrees are postgraduate courses that are separate from under-graduate programmes.
